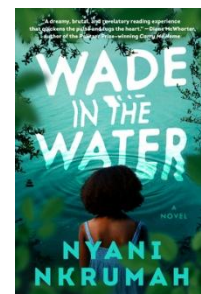
Each year, everyone who is over the age of 73 years must take a Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) from your IRA, 401k, or other tax-deferred investments.

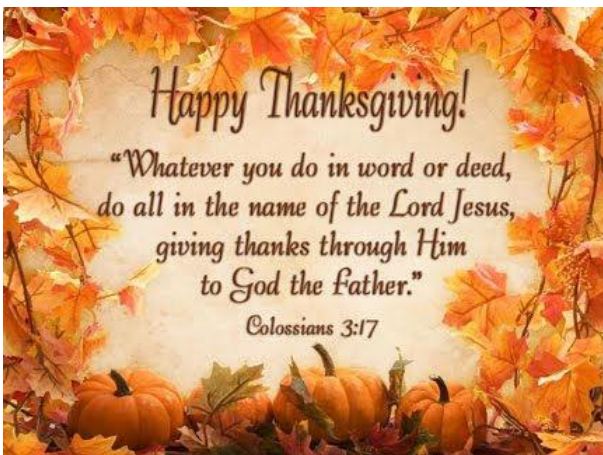

His most recent book is titled, Spiritual Care First Aid: An All-Hands Approach for Church and Community (Fortress, 2025).



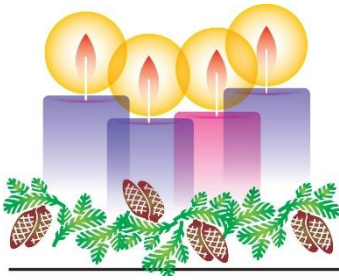
